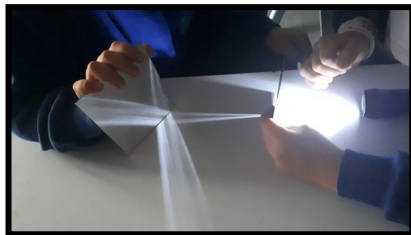
team play was a credit to the practice they've put into rugby over the years.

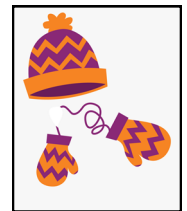


Year 3 Science - Investigating light
