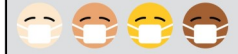

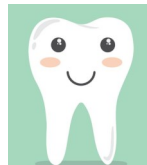

Reception, Yr1 and Yr 2—deadline for fluoride application forms being returned is Tuesday 16. Fluoride varnish is a pleasant tasting protective coating that is easily painted on teeth. Studies show that fluoride varnish is very effective in reducing tooth decay if applied to the teeth at least twice a year. The golden varnish releases fluoride over a period of time, which strengthens teeth and prevents tooth decay. When used in conjunction with fluoride toothpaste and good oral hygiene habits, it can even stop tooth damage that has already started.
